RECORDING YOUR MUSIC DOESN'T HAVE TO BREAK THE BANK



Way back **when I was first thinking about recording my music, I remember feeling overwhelmed** by the potential cost of investing in studio time or fancy equipment. Thankfully, now there are so many free (or nearly free) recording tools. to get you started. But it can be time consuming and confusing searching through all the options out there on the web.

If that's sounds familiar, **this guide is for you**. You'll find an easy to understand and organised list of free options that will truly enable you to start recording your music, right now.

FREE DIGITAL AUDIO WORKSTATIONS

A DAW (Digital Audio Workstation) is the hub of any recording project. Inside this software you'll be able to record, edit and mix your music. Here are three great free options that will enable you to get started with recording, right now.

PRO TOOLS FIRST

Since it's inception back in the early 1990's, Pro Tools quickly became the industry standard DAW for professional recording studios. It was also, rather pricey!

Thankfully, though, Pro Tools have now introduced their free version, Pro Tools First. While this is a lighter version, there is still more than enough included to make great recordings of your music.

GARAGE BAND

Garageband is another great free DAW option, although it's only compatible with Mac computers. If that's your bag, you'll be happy to find a bunch of presets and instruments included to bring your songs to life.

AUDACITY

Now, I must admit, this isn't my favourite option on the list, but Audacity is, never-the-less, worth considering. It is a totally free, stand alone DAW and it does have everything you might need to get started.

However, I find it much less intuitive than options 1 & 2. But some people love it, and that might just be you.

FREE PLUG-INS

You'll find lots of 'plug-ins' inside your DAW, which will enable you to apply effects (and more) to your recordings. But here are a couple of free options you can download to further enhance your set up.

TAL VOCODER

Fancy getting that cool, computerised Imogen Heap sounding effect on your own vocals? Look no further than Tal Vocoder - a free plug-in that emulates the sound of vocoders from the early 80's.

Like the idea of using a DAW but would rather start on something a little more familiar? The Garageband app for iOS is a great place to start. Turn your iPhone and iPad into a fully functioning all-in-one studio with touch instruments at your fingertips.

EASY VOICE RECORDER

Want to record your voice but aren't ready to invest in a microphone just yet? Introducing the Easy Voice Recorder for Android or iOS. Record anywhere at higher quality than your phone's inbuilt app and save your files straight to iCloud.

RØDE REPORTER

Like the Easy Voice Recorder, the RØDE Reporter app gives you the capability to record your voice in high quality from your phone, but this one's for the iOS gals - sorry!

CONDENSER MIC

If you're enjoying working inside a DAW but want better audio recordings to work with, consider a condenser microphone.

These mics will pick up more detail and texture and now come in very budget friendly options, such as the popular Fifine K669 USB Condenser.

RØDE VIDEOOMIC ME

If you'd like to enhance your phone's recording abilities, you might want to consider levelling up with the RØDE VideoMic Me Directional Microphone.

Designed to simply plug into your phone (iPhone's will need an adapter), you'll be accurately capturing high-quality recordings wherever you are.

SERAMONIC MINI MIC

An even cheaper alternative to the RØDE VideoMic Me, this is a great 2nd option for making better recordings with your phone.

KORG KAOSSILATOR

Available for both Android and iOS, this is a powerful synthesiser app that enables you to play with a wide range of electronic and acoustic sounds, much like Korg's very popular Kaossilator pedal.

You also get a sequencer included that will enable you to create tracks by recording and layering your performances.

MOOG FILTRATION

Another budget friendly app is the Moog Filtration. Import any song into the original Filtration inspired controller and start playing with those classic Moog warm, thick textures.

filter modulation, delay, and overdrive to create your own sounds and then incorporate these into your recordings. Oh, and it has some really nice vintage graphics to enhance your Moog experience too!
